# **Chair's Report**

#### **Fabian Pathirana**

The 2022-23 season was one which held many hopes for returning to full season activity, however unrelenting rain throughout the summer meant a number of disruptions. The season started on 01 October as it ended on Sunday 09 April, with rain. The introduction of PlayHQ as the new national registration and competion platform had an obvious impact on the cricket network not only across Hamilton, but throughout the country. Hamilton Cricket would like to thank all the players and volunteers for everybody's effort to embed the platform. It was pleasing to see a return to tamariki and rangatahi cricket after a number of disrupted seasons with some seasonal data showing Hamilton clubs and schools have held steady despite some challenging seasons:

- 2,942 participants (6% female) across 222 teams.
- 267 SuperSmash Hub registrations.
- 32% of schools and 13,075 students received a cricket experience through the SuperSmash school programme offerings.
- 119 tamariki and rangatahi coaches registered.
- Pathway programmes and opportunities delivered for players and coaches between Year 9-13.

It was an exciting season for our Rangatahi representative sides as the Northern Districts Rangatahi tournaments made a welcome return post Covid. Playing opportunities were offered at both tournament but across further fixtures in both Term 4 and Term 1.

The HCA Senior Mens team enjoyed an unprecedented year winning all three Northern Districts tournaments under the guidance of Anton Devcich; Fergus Hickey Rosebowl, Brian Dunning Trophy and the Northern Brave T20 Smash.

At a Senior club, of the twelve competitions played, Star University and Hamilton Old Boys each won four trophies which Marist Suburbs claimed two and Fraser Tech one (the Spark Limited Overs was won by Karaka CC). The Spark Limited Overs competition saw a return to include all Premier teams across Counties Manukau, Hamilton and Waikato Valley with the introduction of semi finals to the competition. The HCA Business House league saw a slight drop in entries (-8 teams) but the return to regular competition play was welcomed by all. There was an exciting addition of an all womens competition across both Hamilton and Waikato Valley which took place in Term 1. Rangatahi team entries remain static from the previous year while tamariki teams saw a welcome increase as new clubs were established and schools reengaged with extra curricular activities post Covid impacted years.

Off the field of play, Hamilton had a significant change with a new Constitution being voted in which means all Board members will now be appointed rather than elected. Cricket also continues to collaborate with the Hamilton City Council regarding the quality and quantity of grounds with a clear vision for future improvement. The partnership with Northern Districts continues to grow year-on-year with ND overseeing community delivery.

The HCA Board would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank everyone involved in cricket for the effort and energy to ensure cricket happened at all possible opportunities.

# **Community Report – Development and Competition**

## **Game Development**

#### Mikayla Gillespie: Development Manager - Waikato

School Delivery – Over 13,000 tamariki and Rangatahi from Hamilton Schools participated in one of the three SuperSmash school programmes (Awareness, Skills and Festival Days). This is around 32% of the student population participating from 41% of Hamilton schools. This is a significant growth from previous seasons, with the introduction of Anna Cooper in the Development Officer - Hamilton and Raglan role a key part of this growth. Poor weather has hindered some school's participation in programmes, particularly in Term 4, however the delivery team have worked hard to ensure as many of these sessions could be rescheduled as The re-establishment of inter-school possible. SuperSmash Festival days after years of cancellations due to covid was exciting, however these had minimal uptake with four schools taking part in a Festival day and another five schools registered for the Raglan Festival which was rained off twice this season.

**Hubs** –267 tamariki registered for a SuperSmash Hub across seven Hamilton hubs. This includes the introduction of a Hub in Huntly, a Year 5-8 Hub in Raglan, and a girls only Hub at Steele Park. The largest of these was held at Discovery Park with 61 participants in Term 4 and 46 in Term 1. The 'Raglan Year 1-4 Hu'b also saw significant growth with 37 participants across the two terms, compared with 11 in 2021/22.

Additional opportunities — The season also saw the return of the highly regarded Backyard Smash event in conjunction with Sport Waikato; This is Me. Over 60 women attended the event at Seddon Park, which aims to provide rangatahi girls and women with an opportunity to experience cricket in a social setting.

A number of additional participation opportunities took place throughout the season, targeting non-traditional cricketing groups. This included a Whanau have-a-go day, in partnership with Parafed Waikato, aimed at providing opportunities to those with disabilities and the inaugural Kilikiti Festival, held at Seddon Park in association with Talents of the Pacific Academy, which saw five Kilikiti teams compete for the title in a day filled with Pacifika celebration and culture.

Club and School Capability - Eleven cricket clubs were active, with the introduction of the new Northern United Sports Club fielding junior teams and Orini Cricket Club combining their team with North Waikato Cricket Club. Eight primary/intermediate schools and seven Secondary schools/colleges entered teams in junior and youth competitions. The number of school's entering teams have reduced slightly due to the increased presence of clubs in the junior space, with six clubs entering junior teams, four of whom were entering junior teams for the first time.

**Coaches** - 119 coaches registered on the national database which is sufficient coverage to coach all junior/youth teams. Support from schools and clubs is critical to best ensure a safe and enjoyable environment.

#### Competitions

# Naomi Matthews – Competitions, Tournaments and Programmes Manager

#### Junior and Youth Competitions -

With both terms fully operational for junior and youth competitions, despite some weather impacts, 120 junior and youth teams competed this year. Numbers are not back to pre-covid but are on an upward trend.

The participant experience is front and centre for HCA across junior and youth competitions, using end of season surveys to provide key information to support the community in their experience and education behind structures of competitions.

#### Senior Competitions -

This season saw the establishment of a Waikato Women's Competition which saw three Waikato-wide clubs produce women's teams to compete across both one-day and T20 formats. In addition to this, a four-week women's social competition was established in the second half of the year, with two teams comprising mostly of women who have never played cricket before.

Senior clubs across HCA maintained mens team numbers compared to last year with 38 teams. The Spark Competition was a good start to the season with Counites Manukau re-joining the competition this year.

Trophies were shared across the majority of clubs, with Hamilton Star University, Hamilton Old Boys, Marist

Suburbs and Fraser Tech all picking up silverware across Premier to C Grade competitions.

The Business House league saw a drop in team entries with 64 competing in the mid-week modified format.

#### Regional and NZC National School tournaments -

With the postponement of regional tournaments in Term 1 2022, both Gillette Cup and Gillette Venus Cup qualifiers for 2022 were held in Term 4 2022. Qualifiers for the 2023 Nationals was held in Term 1 2023.

Gillette Cup (Term 4 22) – Hamilton Boys' High School lost in the final to Tauranga Boys College. St Paul's Collegiate. made it to the semi finals, while St John's College made it to the quarter finals.

Gillette Cup (Term 1 23) — St John's College, St Paul's Collegiate and Hamilton Boys' High School finished 8<sup>th</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> respectively.

Gillette Venus Cup (Term 4 22)— Waikato Diocesan competed, winning the regional tournament and represented ND at the NZC National tournament in December 2022.

Gillette Venus Cup (Term 1 23)— Cambridge High School competed, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup>.

*Junior Secondary School Boys* – St Peter's School, Cambridge competed, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### **Player Registration & Scoring Platform**

This season saw the nation-wide introduction of PlayHQ as the new player registration and scoring platform. While the change process caused a number of challenges across the network, it was great to see the platform fully embedded.

With 2, 942 players recorded in the NZ multiplier census, this shows a nearly identical participation base when compared to last season. The detail of this participation shows a rejuvenation of junior participation and a slight loss of senior participation.

The online scoring across PlayHQ provided some initial challenges but as PlayHQ and NZC released various updates, these improvements saw greater user experiences. NZC continue to work with PlayHQ on additional priorities of implementation ahead of next year. Clubs and schools have again provided great support to ensure that the database of players is accurate and complete.

HCA would like to thank all volunteers across the community game who ensure that participants of all ages and abilities have an opportunity to experience and enjoy our summer game. The season has been a season full of adaptability and agility, but the resilience, mahi and passion of all volunteers has ensured it has been a success.

# **Community Report – Pathway Rangatahi and Senior**

## Rangatahi

#### Deepak Joon: Pathway and Talent Coach - Waikato

The 2022-23 season started with coach appointments in August and continued through until the first week of April. The Pathway Programme for youth and emerging, boys and girls, started with training opportunities which commenced at end of August to mid of September, this included nets sessions and fielding sessions. These trainings provided coaches and selectors opportunities to look at players executing their skills to be able to shortlist the players and then give these shortlisted players match opportunities to showcase their talent in proper game environment. These games were a mix of inter squad games and against other District Association.

The tournament experience was focused on 'Connecting people, Creating memories' and development of players. Hamilton performed well in all Rangatahi tournaments and had a number of significant performances.

In early 2023 there were development opportunities provided to players, including playing opportunities as part of the extended playing calendar for Pathway cricket. Unfortunately, the weather was a major challenge throughout the season and it was a credit to the players and parents for their ongoing resilience. A leadership group was created in both the male and female squads, whilst coach developer opportunities were ongoing.

Thankfully this summer Hamilton were able to be crowned winners for all three. The white ball formats were a key focus as we felt our team could excel in the field and apply pressure to opposition teams with good old-fashion basics, this was the basis of our success. Running hard between wickets and fielding our hearts out, was a good base for us moving forward into the Fergus Hickey.
